

Msgr. Kenneth Morman was ordained in 1973 and served in parish ministry at Tiffin St Joseph and Delphos St John until 1977 when he became the associate pastor of Toledo Rosary Cathedral and began working for Bishop Donovan. In the January 23, 2011 issue of the digital magazine Focus, Msgr. Morman commented, "Those four years serving as Bishop Donovan's secretary and vice chancellor – that gave me a whole sense of the diocesan church that I did not have before." In 1981 Bishop Hoffman sent Msgr. Morman to Rome to study scripture at the Pontifical Biblical Institute so he could assist with Scripture education for adults in the diocese. Upon his return he developed a scripture curriculum for the lay ministry program and served as an assistant to Bishop Hoffman in the Chancery of the diocese. He also served on the National Advisory Council to the U. S. Bishops for several years and was elected to the diocesan Priest's Personnel Board, an advisory body to the bishop for the placement of priests. Other experiences he cites as having a significant impact on his priesthood include teaching students at Tiffin Calvert High School, being chaplain of Bowling Green St. Thomas University Parish and serving as associate pastor of three parishes in the East Toledo north Cluster. In 2005 Msgr. Morman was released for service on loan to the Archdiocese of Cincinnati to serve at Mount St. Mary's seminary of the West as Dean of Students and co-Director of Field Education and instructor in Holy Scripture.
